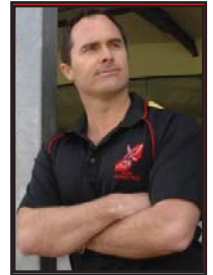

Coaches Reports

Seniors - Round 14 vs South Croydon

Today it was wonderful to be back at the 'Fort' after a very successful fortnight of games away from home. We were going for our 6th win in a row and the first time in the clubs 1st division history that this rich vein of form has happened. The boys were very focused after last week losing the tackle count and getting beaten in some areas we really pride ourselves on against Mulgrave really fired them up. We made sure we addressed the lack of 'held' tackles with a quick refresher course on tackling Thursday night. How wonderful they responded. Leading into the game I was most pleased to see some KEY omissions from the South Croydon team, which boosted my confidence of getting the right result, but I definitely didn't highlight it before the game.



We started like I knew we would as we were very focused in the lead up and in the rooms. In the first quarter we had 15 inside 50's to 4 and to score 10 times from 15 entries showed we were dominating the game. South Croydon's entries were quite shallow and all credit goes to our mids and backline who were very composed and allowed us to play the game on our terms right from the outset. Another Key Indicator that was most pleasing to see was the defensive strategy we use was again successful as we were able to hold another side scoreless for a quarter. The very minor concern was our inability to kick straight as we missed some very gettable ones and kicked 6 behinds. 3 times Clarkey used his body to guard a drop zone for the ball to go to then mark. It was good reward as he has been working on this. Our attack on the footy was the best I had seen for a long time and to also have guys taking contested marks like Rizza, George and Clarkey was tremendous. We went in 30 points up.

All positive messages were expressed to the playing group at the break they just simply had to carry on as all rotations were rolling well and it was panning out to be a very good day for the club. We were even more dominant this quarter with 14 entries Inside 50 to 2. From these 14 entries we scored 14 times. Our efficiency was working at 100% for the quarter. This was mainly due to Rizza who was really working over his opponent as he got the match up we thought he would. This is why we moved him out of the rotations this week. It proved a great move, as he would've had more than 20 marks across the ground. It was great to see BJ giving us some run off Half Back and Spesh tackling and chasing down the opposition. Willo was gathering some important ball in the middle and clearing it to our advantage where Joel also goaled from a heavy knock and he also played his best game for the year. We went into the main break 68 points up. Our defense was again outstanding as they got their first score from a silly free kick at the end of the quarter.

Again the 3rd quarter started with a Rizza special (a great contested mark), Bakesy continues to play excellent footy and the 1's continue to remain in his game at all times and it was in this quarter he laid a great tackle after a real committed chase. We were shepherding at all times and our pressure across all lines was first class and exactly what we are about. MJ continues to impress with his chasing, leg speed, running on angles and holding tackles. Our wingers were dominant all day in Georgy and Jake Mowat. Their composure and speed is a real strength of ours now. Jake has come to the club at a perfect time. Unfortunately the 3rd quarter was our worst for the day but we still held on to win the quarter by 19 points. We lead at the last break by 87 points. This was the first time for the year you could safely say we could throw the rotations around and give our players a rest in all positions, as it has been a grueling couple of months.

During the last quarter it was brilliant to see all players fully continue to commit their bodies and run the game out. We continued to play the way we expect and all players continue to realize they need to play as a team to hold their spot in the team and this is why we continue to get the results we have recently. Patty continues to structure up well and show enormous composure at crucial times. Jake and Saundo continued to be really strong in tackles and their stoppage work continues to impress us all. A wonderful day to coach the Knox FC with a very pleasing result!

We must now prepare ourselves mentally and physically for the biggest game of the year. East Burwood stopped our run last time and we need to get over them at our home ground this time. It would be great to see a massive amount of Falcons down at the FORT again this week, as if we win this one, finals are a certainty!

Seniors - Round 15 vs East Burwood

We welcomed East Burwood to the 'Fort' a place where we have been in a rich vein of form since our Round 1 loss to Blackburn all be it from a terrible first 4 minutes. We had prided ourselves to never loss at home since this time.

The day started quite slowly for us until Tredders goaled on the run after picking off the ball from a wonderful handball. East Burwood were first in and were getting rewarded so it really was time for us to step up in an area we had been good at all year as we went in a goal down at quarter time. We were lucky to be this close as we were messy going forward, indecisive when going through the middle and undisciplined at crucial times. One in which a goal was scored as a result. Clarkey had rolled up well to tackle and pressure up through the middle. Our defense had to KILL the ball on the line and rush it through as they got an unforgivable one again at a crucial time. Inside 50m were the same and we were down in terms of clearances.

This quarter was a worst for the day and it continued on the way the first one finished. Willo was marking everything in defense and needed more support from runners to get the ball moving into dangerous areas quicker. Our pressure was down on previous weeks and we lost the quarter, which then placed us 15 points down at the main break. Centre clearances were excellent however, around the ground we were no where near as dominant. We gave away free kicks from being behind, our skills were poor and we were behind at stoppages.

During the next quarter we again for the 3rd week in a row we did not punch from behind, and this was very disappointing to observe. Willo was continuing to try to get us over the line and form some sort of momentum. This was our best quarter as we reduced the margin to 11 points. They had slowed down and we continued to run but not enough. Flip was great whenever it came into his area. We were on top in all clearance areas and it was clear we just needed a little bit of luck to really swing the momentum. Joel was having his best quarter for the day and it was also great to see Bolts take a strong mark and gain in confidence. With all the hard work we expended in the 3rd quarter we still could not quite get in front on the scoreboard. East Burwood were very disciplined and made it hard for us to do so. We had our whole backline applying pressure all quarter but our offense needed to back themselves to have a shot on goal and try to create something rather than being indecisive and turning the ball over in our forward line. We really did run out of time but were outplayed in many areas we pride ourselves in.

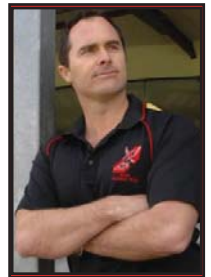

Seniors - Round 16 vs Noble Park

This week saw us travel to Noble Park in a game we were looking forward to, as we knew it would be a real challenge and we wanted to see where our young group of players were at in terms of matching it with the top sides of 1st division. It was the first time we were to play them for the season and to play them after a loss was not ideal but what better way to get back on the horse and play last years premiers.



I was happy with the initial intensity from the beginning of the match however once general play began to settle and both teams were getting a feel for the tempo Noble Park really stepped up. Their onballers were first to the ball and on the move and with their strong forwards playing in front and being very strong over-head it made it very difficult for our backline. Inside 50's were similar however ours needed more penetration and purpose, as they were not allowing us to enter with composure. We were under pressure.

It was great to see Patty take them on a few times off Half Back and with Willo getting in low in the centre and trying to give us first use was pleasing. We lost the clearances in the 1st and 3rd quarters but breaking even in the 2nd was pleasing. What was even more pleasing was the overall learning and development that can come of the whole game. We played a very good side today but winning the last quarter was real a credit to our boys as I don't believe the scoreboard flattered us too much.

However, the 3rd quarter we were chasing their tails and they just continued to back themselves with run and carry through lines that were very difficult to stop. Not only this but it was great for our guys to see how to use the footy with foot skills of a very high level. It was pretty simple today, as we were beaten by a more mature side who continually backed themselves. It now up to us coaches to educate our players in roles they need to play to ensure they learnt plenty from games like this. Personally I feel sometimes games like this are great for the development of all our players.

Some areas we need to work on will be that some of our structures were to slow to set up and simply did not adjust quick enough so we will be working on tweaking these for the rest of the season. Kicking 4 goals to 3 in the last was evidence we can match it with the best we obviously need to sustain that for 4 quarters. To do this we need to have their onballers held with greater accountability and apply more pressure to their ball carriers and to their forwards.

There were occasions where we gave them too much time to hit targets and this is what has been great for us this season. It was also pleasing to see some of the KPI's we take we were competitive especially inside 50's (however they were not deep enough or to our advantage enough, held tackles and tackles inside 50. We look forward to playing Norwood next week away as we are still searching for that next win to consolidate a final on our own merit.
